

SAYS PERSHING SUCCESS HANGS ON VOTE AT HOME

Wyoming Political Leader Says Convention Decision May Be Settled in Nebraska Primary

Washington, April 5.—(Special.)—"If the Chicago convention fails to nominate the fourth ballot, the nominee will be a dark horse," declared Patrick Sullivan, republican national committeeman for Wyoming, who is in Washington to confer with political leaders.

"I cannot see how any of those actively chasing the nomination can hope that the delegates of this time apparently precludes any of the active candidates could be swung to another. The inevitable will be the selection of a 'dark horse'."

Wyoming for Pershing

Wyoming's delegation will go unopposed, according to Committee Chairman Sullivan, unless it is deemed advisable, at the state convention at Sheridan, May 10, to instruct for Pershing.

"I am surprised at the growth of Pershing sentiment in Washington since my last visit here a month ago. I have talked with many leaders here, and find many whose views agree with mine. In my opinion the people of Nebraska have an opportunity to very greatly advance Pershing by showing their appreciation of him with a substantial primary vote."

Sentiment Changing Fast

"The Wyoming national committeeman is a close student of republican politics, travels much and enjoys the personal acquaintance and friendship of all of the big men of his party. He is a very close friend of Chairman Hays, and the national committee chairman is one of Sullivan's warmest admirers. According to Sullivan, friends of Leonard Wood are claiming a much larger number of delegates than they can vote in the convention. For example, in the total claimed are many contesting delegates who may or may not be seated. With a majority of the delegates unseated, the first ballot will not indicate a perfect Nebraska ticket, and candidates are not expected to show a swing from Lowden, Harding, Wood or Johnson forces to any one of the four. The result, according to Sullivan, will be that a candidate will have to be found outside of these four actives."

Up to Nebraska.

At this juncture, declared Sullivan, if the friends of General Pershing can come forward backed by a convincing endorsement from the people of his home state in the form of a big primary vote, the Nebraska will strongly appeal to the convention as an ideal candidate, fully measuring up to qualifications, and he will be there from Wyoming to do our part."

New York Man Beats Wife's Brains Out With Club and Axe

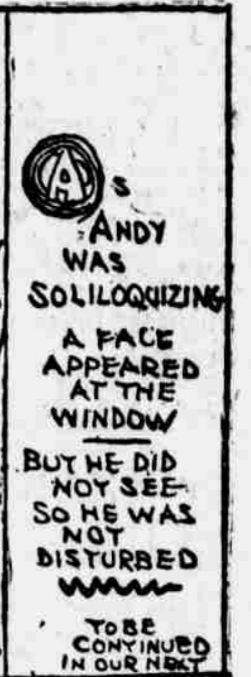
