Washington coming ahead of it.

The public utilities commission is conducting an inquiry into conditions here and much of the testimony is spirited. W. A. Day of Frost & Co., who tried to use a tele-phone from 25 to 50 times a day, told of his exasperating experiences, but admitted that the service here was better than that in New York and Washington.

The evidence shows that tele-phone meters, like gas and electric light meters, keep right on working regardless of whether any service is being rendered or not.
