SENATE AGAIN TAKES UP WORK-ON STRIKE BILLS

Cummins Measure Revised And Presented by Frelinghuysen—Three New Proposals Introduced.

Chicago Tribune-Omaha Bee Leased Wire. Washington, April 14.—Spurred by the menace of a nationwide transportation tieup, the senate Tuesday set itself earnestly to work devising measures not merely to deal with the present "outlaw" walk-out, but to safeguard the country permanently against the frequent recurrence of railroad strikes.

Months ago the senate recorded its belief that the proper method of solving the railroad labor problem was the enactment of anti-strike legislation. The house took an opposite view and forced the adoption of an arbitration provision.

Three new bills dealing with the railroad situation made their appearance. Senator Frelinghuysen of New Jersey cut the anti-strike clause out of the old Cummins railroad bill and offered it as a separate new bill.
