Greek Wins Boston Race; Will Represent America

Boston, April 19.—The American marathon road race, commemorating the feat of a Grecian soldier who ran from the Plains of Marathon to Athens with a military message and then dropped dead, was won by a native of Marathon, Peter Trikoupidas. A resident of New York, but still a subject of Greece, he proved the fittest of the 60 runners. The classic 25-mile race was the official test for election of the United States representative at the Olympiad. Two former winners of the event finished second and third, these honors going, respectively, to Arthur V. Roth of the Dorchester club, leader in 1916, and Carl W. A. Lindner of Quincy, winner last year. William Wick, also of Quincy, was fourth and Edwin H. White of New York was fifth.

Olympic Entrant Wins. Breaks Swimming Record.

Brussels, April 19.—Marcel Guilleminot, the speedy French cross-country runner, won the eight-mile Belgian cross-country championship, making the distance in 43 minutes 25 seconds. Guilleminot is entered as a middle distance runner for the Olympic games at Antwerp. Newark N. J., April 19.—Frank L. Kramer defeated Raymond Eaton, the professional bike champion of America, in two out of three heats of a one-mile match race before more than 2,000 spectators.
