**Wireless Apparatus Tuned for Messages From 50,000 Meters**

Wireless apparatus, claimed by its operators, Dr. Frederick Millener and Harvey Gerner of Cedar Creek, to be the most powerful ever assembled in this country, was tuned for messages from Mars Wednesday night. Dr. Millener and Mr. Gerner "listened in" for remarks from the red planet, but were not rewarded.

According to Dr. Millener, 30 miles of wire is used in the aerial and a wave length of 50,000 meters is possible. Early Wednesday night they used a shorter wire, and asserted that they heard all large radio stations on this continent, as well as several in Europe and South America.

They plan to keep the apparatus assembled and continue their watch for messages from other planets.

Learned is now serving as acting chairman, taking up the work at the time of the resignation of Robert W. Devoe of Lincoln. Ben S. Baker, county chairman, will issue soon the call for republican county convention, May 11. This convention will be entitled to 207 delegates.

**"Overall Clubs" Started By High School Students**

Principal Dwight E. Porter of the High School of Commerce announced yesterday that he will permit the students to form an "Overall club." Students who wish to join the "overall club" must wear the overalls until the end of the school semester, early in June. Several members of the graduating class will start wearing overalls next Monday. Over 200 students are expected to enroll as members of the club.

A similar movement was started at Central High Wednesday when Principal Masters announced that students can organize an "overall club," providing several hundred students join.

**Masonic Service is Observed at Funeral Of Dr. Henry Akin**

Masonic services were held at the funeral of Dr. Henry Akin, 1028 South Thirty-first street, prominent Omaha physician, at the chapel at Forest Lawn cemetery Thursday afternoon.

A body of Dr. Akin's associates in the Masonic order paid final tribute as the body was being lowered into the grave.

Dr. Robert Leavens of the First Unitarian church officiated. Harry Easton and Kendall Hammond, representing the American Legion, of which Dr. Akin had been a member, were present.

Dr. Akin's dead body was found early Wednesday morning in his garage at 1130 South Thirty-first street. A bottle that had contained poison was beside the body.

County Attorney Shotwell pronounced suicide.

Dr. Akin's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry L. Akin, survive.
