Harold R. Robbins, youngest son of the retired financier, was reporting to the police the fact that his father was missing when a workman named Innes was telephoning the

finding of the body under the bales of hay. Robbins left his home at 7:55 Monday night for a short walk in compliance with instructions from his physician. His son, who usually accompanied him, failed to go along that night, and Mrs. Robbins told police she had a premonition that something terrible might happen.

The latest theory of the authorities is that Robbins was killed in an attempt to avenge the shooting of an unidentified burglar, in the vicinity of the Robbins home recently. No other motive has been uncovered by police.

Robbins had apparently been beaten over the head and then choked with a rope.


