**UNI STUDENTS STUDY STOCK OF OMAHA PACKERS**  
 Sixty Members of Freshman Class Guests of Stockyards To Study Beef Types Of Cattle.

After spending the day as guests of the management of the Stock Yards company at a dinner in the Exchange building and being entertained by superintendent of the various packing plants Thursday, 60 students from the Nebraska university taking the freshmen course in judging and studying market types of cattle returned to Lincoln last night.

The party was in charge of Professors W. H. Shavin and W. J. Loeffel, members of the animal husbandry faculty of the university. They arrived at the yards in the morning at 9 and devoted the day to the study of the various types of stock rather than to the top-notchers, with a view of investigating the practical and professional side of the business rather than the ethical or theoretical.

Part of the afternoon was spent in inspecting the packing plants, where they witnessed demonstrations of meat cutting and other activities.
