Chicago, May 11—More than 1,000 men, women and children stormed the corridors of the eighth and ninth floors of the city hall Monday to engage in the legal battle between landlords and tenants. There were numerous incipient riots and one excited woman chewed the hand of a bailiff when he sought to calm her.

Oats were effected by the wet and colder weather over the belt and a report that 500,000 bushels of Canadian were now afloat on the lakes for Chicago, and finished 3/16c lower. Rye wintered under pressure from long and lost 1/4c, while barley was off 3/4c.
