

STOLID DIGNITY WINS RELEASE FOR CHINAMEN

Five Celestials Manipulate Oriental Calm to Good Advantage as White Men Rave.

Five Chinamen, in District Judge Estelle's court yesterday displaying perfect calm, dignity and gentility, while two prominent white men engaged in bitter altercation. The Chinamen were charged with gambling.

The five Chinamen rejoice in the names Eep Sing, Jim Chin, Turn Lam, Joe Charlie and Jim Lee. The two white men are yclept Bennie Danbaum, detective, and John MacFarland, attorney.

The five men of the oriental race sat wrapped in the calm of Buddha which saith, "Be not troubled by the misfortunes of life; only when the soul is injured can harm come to you."

Judge Quells Anger. The two men of the white race darted looks of anger between them. Danbaum said across the table to the attorney that he, the attorney, had stated a "bald-faced lie" to the court.

"I won't be talked to by a policeman like that," exclaimed Mr. MacFarland. "This man tells me I stated a bald-faced lie to the court. I've practiced in this court for 35 years and I've never had such a thing said to me."

"Danbaum," said the judge, "I don't want any such talk in this court. You're treated decently here and we expect decent treatment from you. Don't let that happen again."

"If I hit him and knocked him down, then there'd be," exclaimed Mr. MacFarland, waving his arms to show what there would be.

"Judge, your honor," explained Danbaum, "I didn't state that Mr. MacFarland stated a bald-faced lie. I just told him what that Chinaman testified was a lie."

And the five Chinamen sat quietly and solemnly on their bench, scarcely listening to the altercation, but wrapped in the calm of the orient, doubtless meditating upon the words of Confucius, "Bitter words gain nothing, but peace abideth with him who answereth not in wrath."

And the five Chinamen were all released and went forth free men. They were arrested in a raid on 112 North Twelfth street last November. Certain heads and dominos were taken and also certain money. They appeared from the police court, where they were fined \$10 each.

SWITCHMAN CUT IN TWAIN AS CARS RUN OVER HIS BODY

Omaha Railroad Man Killed As Engine Backs Up Unexpectedly.

Joseph E. Doherty, railroad switchman, 959 North Twenty-sixth street, was almost instantly killed at 1:30 a. m. yesterday when he was run over by freight cars in the Missouri Pacific switching yards at Fourteenth and Grace streets.

He lived but 15 minutes after the accident. Witnesses say Doherty was uncoupling two cars when the switch engine at the other end backed up. His body was cut nearly in twain by the trucks of the cars running over his abdomen. He died before an ambulance arrived at the scene.

Doherty was 35 years old. He was born and reared in Omaha. His widow, two sisters and mother, Mrs. Emily Doherty, survive.
