Spanish Potatoes.
Boil potatoes in skins. When almost done remove from kettle and

place in water (same as for potato salad). Remove skin from as many as required, cut up one small onion, place in baking pan, sprinkle onion with a little finely chopped parsley. Lay over them one or two thin slices of fat pork. Put very little water under; place in oven to cook to a light brown. Serve.

Hollandaise Potatoes.
Cut boiled potatoes in quarters. If potatoes are large cut into eighths. Pour over melted butter flavored with lemon juice. Season with salt and paprika and cook about 10 minutes in the oven; then sprinkle with parsley, one and a half cupsful of potatoes to two tablespoonfuls butter and half a teaspoonful lemon juice.
