

### ARREST FRIEND FOR KNOWLEDGE OF MISSING MAN

Frank Megy Held After He Offers Reward for Information of Whereabouts of John Kilyan.

Frank Megy, 1821 Arbor street, who offered a \$200 reward for information leading to the whereabouts of John Kilyan, 4506 North Sixteenth street, who disappeared from Omaha Easter Sunday, was arrested yesterday afternoon by Detectives Troby and Bolan in connection with the disappearance of Kilyan and held for investigation.

Negy was given a grilling by Chief of Detectives John T. Dunn and denied he knew anything about the missing man. Dunn says he has witnesses who saw Negy with Kilyan Easter Sunday in a Ford car and Kilyan appeared to be asleep. Negy drove down Sixteenth street with the "sleeping Kilyan" in the Ford and drove him out West Cuming street to Benson, according to Chief Dunn.

"Negy's story does not agree with that of the witnesses who saw him with Kilyan. He knows more about it than he is telling."

Negy and Kilyan left the home of Joseph Varga, 1429 North Eleventh street, Easter Sunday, after telling Varga they were going to a neighborhood drug store. He has not been seen since.

**Stories in Conflict.**

Negy told police yesterday that Kilyan got out of the Ford car at Sixteenth and Dodge streets while witnesses say Kilyan was still in the car when Negy was driving west in Cuming street.

Kilyan had \$82 in his pockets when he disappeared. He was employed as a machinist at the Union Pacific shops.

He also owns his home. His wife and children are in Australia.
