

# Rourke's Tied for Third Place In Western League Race

## VICTORY OVER JOPLIN BOOSTS TEAM STANDING

### Fuhr Relieves Schatzman in Tight Place and Omaha Cleans Up Joplin Series.

By trouncing Joplin Miners, 4 to 1, yesterday, the Rourke's not only stepped into first division from the cellar section berth they have occupied since the opening day of the season, but they tied the count for third place with Tulsa.
