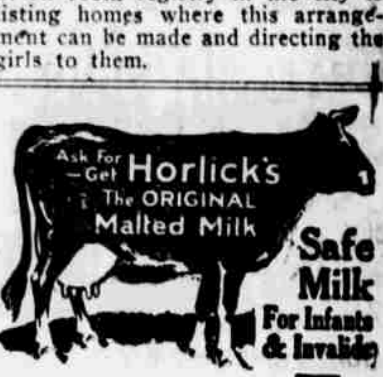
Office Girls Turn Nurse Maids—Give Help For Rooms.
