How He Forced Unwilling, Imperialistic Diplomats to Accept League of Nations May Be Told to Congress.

UNPUBLISHED SECRETS INCLUDED IN MESSAGE

President Believes by Prolonging Technical State of War He Will Discredit Opponents And Control Convention.

C., May 22 .-(Special.)-President Wilson, it was learned today, has practically completed the message to congress in which he will veto the Knox resolution repealing the declaration of war against the imperial German government and restoring a state of peace between Germany and the United States.

Ever since, it became apparent that congress would pass the peace resolution for want of ratification of resolution for want of ratification of the Versailles treaty the president has been engaged in the preparation of the veto message, which one of his confidants says will be the great-est state paper Mr. Wilson has pro-
