Sooners Climb Out of Last Place Win From Joplin

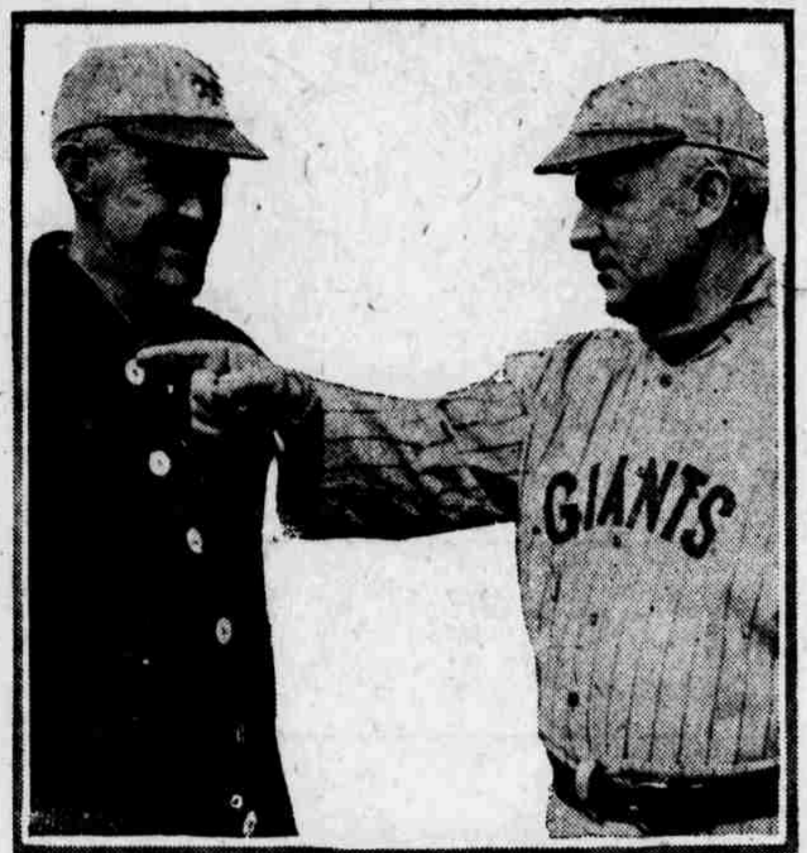
