

WOMAN KILLED HERSELF, DOCTOR TELLS OFFICIALS

Autopsy Shows Mrs. Marian Buckley Committed Suicide—Expect Husband to Be Freed.

Mrs. Marian Buckley, 2861 Whitmore avenue, who died early yesterday morning as a result of a bullet wound in her right temple, committed suicide.

This is the opinion of Coroner's Physician S. McCleneghan, who performed an autopsy over the body yesterday afternoon at Gentlemen's mortuary. The autopsy was demanded by W. N. Jamieson, Buckley's attorney.

Dr. McCleneghan said the two bullet wounds in Mrs. Buckley's temple were caused by the bullet splitting in two after it had struck the dead woman's skull.

Only One Bullet.

"The two holes in Mrs. Buckley's head were caused by one bullet," Dr. McCleneghan said. "The bullet split in two after striking the skull, half of it lodging in the brain and the other half coming out. If the police will make a thorough search of the basement in the Buckley home, they will find the remainder of the bullet. In my opinion, Mrs. Buckley ended her own life."

Joseph G. Buckley, the husband, who had been held by the police in connection with the death of his wife, probably will be exonerated by the coroner's jury which will inquire into the cause of Mrs. Buckley's death at Gentlemen's mortuary at 2 this afternoon, is the opinion of police.

Kills Self in Basement.

Buckley was taken into custody a few hours after his wife was found shot in the basement of their home early Tuesday morning, when Dr. John J. Gleason, their family physician, told police there were two bullet wounds in Mrs. Buckley's right temple.

Buckley told police that his wife went into the basement, shortly after they had arrived home, to smoke a cigarette. A few minutes later Buckley and his father, Charles Buckley, found his wife lying in a pool of blood.

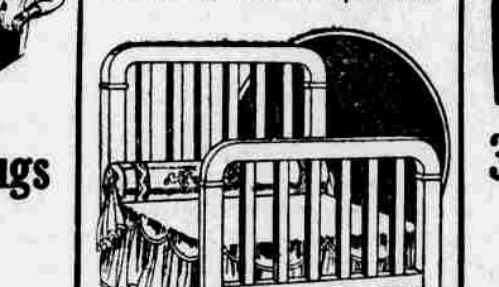
