

LOWDEN CHANCES NOT MATERIALLY HURT BY CHARGES

Illinois Governor Conceded Fine Opportunity for Nomination by Season Politicians.

Chicago, June 5.—Developments Friday in the big republican free-for-all to be staged at the Coliseum next week, indicated that of the avowed candidates for presidential nomination, Governor Lowden of Illinois has the best chance of carrying off the prize.

The seasoned republican veterans, who began appearing on the scene Friday, I found, do not expect the delegates to name glibber Gen. Wood or Senator Johnson.

The prevalent understanding is that Wood is slated for early elimination from the contest. The general is up against a volume of opposition, which seems to be well nigh insuperable.

The most hopeful of the Wood managers think they see 350 votes in sight for the general on about the third ballot, but that is as far as they are willing to go in the line of prediction when discussing the situation frankly.

The Johnson managers do not expect the senator to get within shouting distance of the nomination unless both Wood and Lowden should be eliminated and then their chief hope lies in a possible stampede of the convention to the California senator.

A convention in which there are 300 delegates who sat in the convention of 1916 and 300 veterans of the convention of 1912, however, is not likely to be stampeded.

Lowden occupies the strategic position in convention calculations that he has held for several weeks. His reserve strength made up of the pledges of several hundred delegates for second choice, makes him formidable to begin with.

It remains to be seen whether the Lowden candidacy is permanently injured by the revelations of the payment of Lowden campaign funds to the Missouri delegates who appropriated the money to their own use instead of expending it in primary organization.

There is clear indication among the delegates arriving today, however, that the Illinois governor has not been appreciably injured in public esteem by the Washington testimony, chiefly because he lost no time in demonstrating that he turned over the fund to be expended in Missouri for legitimate organization purposes and that he was taken advantage of by a couple of unscrupulous delegates.

The Missouri delegation will meet in Chicago next Monday to discuss the expenditure of \$38,000 of Lowden campaign funds in their state, it was announced today.

The opposition to Governor Lowden in Chicago is confined to the democratic press and representatives of the democratic party, according to Senator Lawrence Sherman.

The suggestion that friends of our candidates are seeking to undermine Senator Johnson's strength in the Michigan and Nebraska delegations led him to say: "I would not say that I think it is going on, but I have had it suggested that it was."

"I have no plank on the league of nations platform." "I have none here, but I understand one has been prepared, of which I am not at liberty to speak, that I develop."

Angry Mob Races to Stake Claims in New Open Diamond Fields

Chicago, June 5.—Ten thousand people, including many women, pegged claims in the new diamond fields at Tangus in the Bechuanaland, South Africa, on opening day, according to a cable dispatch.

The district is 100 miles north of Kimberley, in a waterless, treeless, gameless desert. Reports of its wonderful riches became rife when diamonds were found there several months ago.

When the government's opening proclamation was read the crowd was massed behind a flag line. A revolver shot started the race. The mob burst across the sands in a mad scramble.

It was a no-holds-barred and un-suddenly insane. Men fought and clawed and knocked each other down, while those behind trampled over the fallen.
