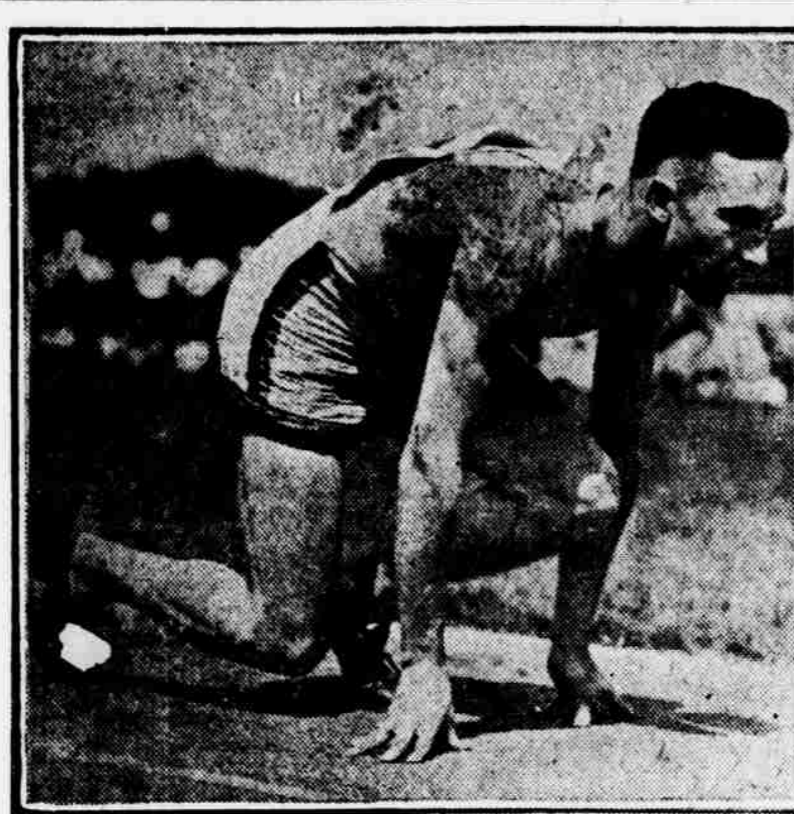

Martin and Bailey Driven from Box in Fifth—Haines Also Knocked Out.

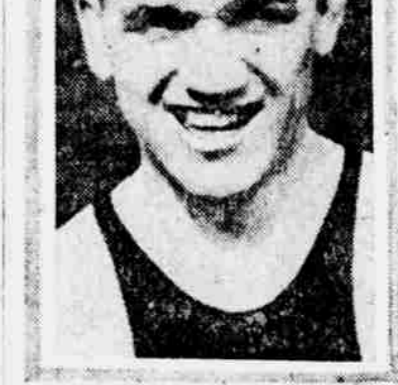

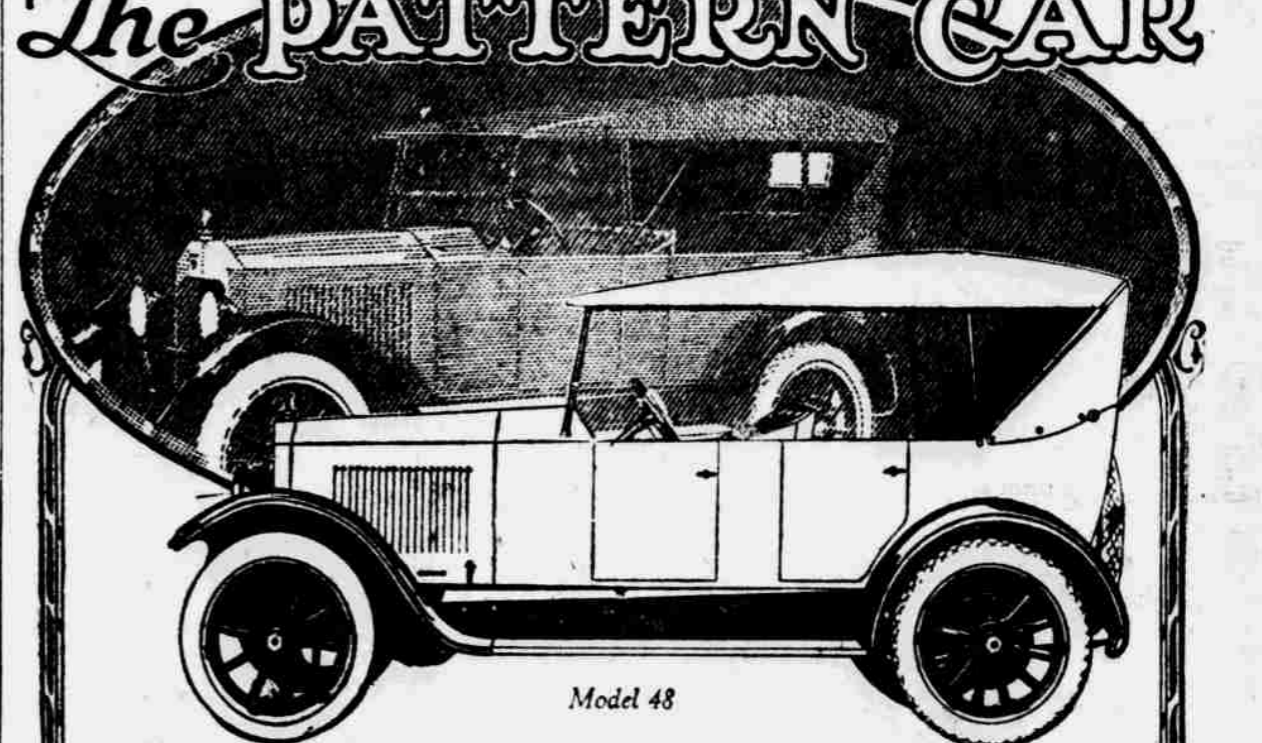
