IN RATE HEARING

Increased Rates Useless Until Labor Conditions Are Adjusted, Witnesses Tell Commerce Commission.

Washington, June 11.-Pacific coast and southwestern state railway commissioners today determinedly opposed before the Interstate Commerce commission the proposed increase in freight rates. "You could increase rates over

night, but it would avail nothing un-less you adjusted the labor troubles," declared J. B. Campbell of Spokane, Wash, representing shippers and the state commissions of Washington, Montana, Idaho, Utah, New Mexico,

Nevada and Arizona.
"If the terms of the new trans-portation act are to be construed to mean that the carriers shall be granted increased rates every time and as often as they are able to show that their combined incomes do not amount to 6 per cent on the aggregate of their book values, then may the Lord help the shipping and consuming public!"
