Is Asbestos Fireproof? In spite of the fact that it appears to be of a vegetable nature -somewhat resembling a heavy, rough cotton fabric-asbestos is a mineral which is particularly abundant in Sweden, Corsica, Cornwall and the Island of Anglesea, near Wales. It is of a silky nature, with fine threads which may be woven together in the form in which we generally know it. The fact that, being a rock, it is impervious to fire, renders it valuable in commerce, and the ancients used it extensively for shrouds and other purposes. In preparing asbestos the stone is first soaked in warm water, then picked to pieces so that the earthy matter and other ingred ients of the rock may be washed out. After this process has been repeated several times the fila-






