

CUBANS POOL TO CURB SALES OF SUGAR FOR RISE

Growers, Mill Owners and Brokers Agree to Shun Market Until Price Reaches 24 Cents.

Havana, June 30.—Cuban cane growers, sugar mill owners and brokers, claiming to control the sale of 2,180,000 sacks of unsold sugar, were on record today as definitely pledged not to offer any more sugar for sale until the price had reached 24 cents a pound, the level reached during the last half of May.

This decision was reached at a mass meeting held last night, which was presided over by Miguel Arango, president of the Association of Hacendados and Colonos of Cuba. At this meeting a committee of 12, headed by Arango, was selected to act as the exclusive selling agency of those represented at the meeting. Participants pledged themselves to withdraw from the market all offers for the sale of sugar and to sell none except through the medium of the committee, which is pledged to make no sales for less than 24 cents a pound.

The amount of unsold Cuban sugar was estimated by a member of the selling committee as 3,920,000 sacks, their holdings of 2,180,000 sacks, leaving only 1,740,000 sacks under outside control. Efforts are being made to bring these into the pool.

Deputy Sheriff Held For Murder in Fatal Religious Mob Fight

Monroe, Mich., June 30.—Albert Sherman, a deputy sheriff, arrested on a charge of murder in connection with the rioting of religious factions at Rabidoux Corners Sunday night in which Walter Gibby was killed, was arraigned last night, pleaded not guilty and was remanded to jail. Pending his hearing, no bail was granted.

In a statement to Prosecutor Haas Sherman admitted participating in the shooting, claiming he acted in self-defense, after fire had been opened by the group of men who came here from Erie, Mich., to protest against alleged criticism of Catholic leaders by Louis I. King, a Toledo evangelist.

Special Mexican Envoy Seeks Official Interview

Washington, June 30.—Fernando Iglesias Calderon, special ambassador of the present government in Mexico, sent to the United States on a special mission, has asked for an interview with Acting Secretary of State Davis, which will be granted. It is understood at the department that Mr. Calderon wishes to present arguments in favor of recognition of the new Mexican regime by the United States.

The American embassy at Mexico City advised the department today that reports were published yesterday that Gen. Carlos Osona had rebelled in the state of Tamaulipas against the present government.

New Mexican Revolt Is Quickly Crushed; Defeat Rebel Troops

Mexico City, June 30.—The attempted revolution of Gen. Carlos Osona in the state of Tamaulipas was crushed after only a few hours of life, according to official dispatches from Ciudad Victoria to the ministry of war today. General Osona's revolutionary troops were reported to have been defeated by federal troops under Gen. Arnulfo Gomez at La Diana, a few miles north of Ciudad Victoria.

General Osona had announced he is not in sympathy with the policies of General de la Huerta and General Obregon, and that he would attempt to overthrow the government.

Wilson Receives Copy of Resolution Praising Him

Washington, June 30.—A telegraphic copy of the resolution adopted by the democratic national convention praising the achievement of President Wilson in the conduct of the war and congratulating him on his recovery was delivered today to the president. It had been delivered in transit. There was no information as to whether the president would send a reply.

Federal Agents Take Hand in Elwell Murder Probe

New York, June 30.—The federal government today took a hand in the investigation of the mysterious murder of Joseph Rowne Elwell. Revenue agents were brought into the case by the report that Elwell was involved in an illegal whisky deal and was trading with bootleggers at the time he was shot.
