South Side ONE MAN IS SHOT, 30 OTHERS NABBED FOR IOWA HOLDUP

Four Are Held in Connection With Train Robbery and For Fleecing Farmer Of \$1,800.

Officers wounded one man and arrested three others in the railroad yards at Twenty-ninth and H streets early Thursday morning. The four men are held for investigation in connection with the robbery of a box car and a holdup at Pacific Junction, Ia., Wednesday night, in which the victim, a farmer, lost \$1,800.

The arrested were taken to St. Joseph hospital. His right leg was badly shattered. Hospital attendants say they are unable to understand the name he gives and he is booked as "John Doe." The other men gave their names as Frank Johnson, Sioux City; Thomas Coyle, Detroit, Mich., and Bert Farman, Chicago.

South Side police say Coyle and Farman answer descriptions given by the victims of the two highway-men who robbed him. He is expected in Omaha today to identify his alleged assailants.
