

# PAL URGED HIM INTO ROBBERY, BANDIT WAILS

**Youthful Desperado In Waterloo Fiasco Blames Companion Who Professes to Be "Hard Boiled."**

Influenced by glowing descriptions of excitement and high life, Oscar Yoss, 19 years old, farm boy from Grenada, Colo., was "talked into" taking part in the unsuccessful robbery of the Bank of Waterloo Friday, he declared yesterday.

As he sat in his cell beside John Gau, Neumeyer hotel, Council Bluffs, in the county jail, Yoss told of his growing weary of life on the farm in Colorado and his craving for something new.

"I met Gau in Worland, Wyo., last June," Yoss said.

"He was a good scout to me, and we planned to work in the harvest fields together.

**Gau Craved Excitement.**

"But Gau wanted excitement. He said he knew where we could have some fun.

"He told of having two grips in Waterloo, and we drove in his car to the town to get them.

"Behind a pile of railroad ties near the Elkhorn river, he showed me a pair of revolvers and said how easy it would be to 'make' a bank.

"I listened to his chatter and gave in. We pulled off the job.

"Every second I wanted to beat it out of the place. But it was all over in no time.

"When the gang caught up with us, we didn't even think of shooting. We just gave up, that's all."

Yoss takes his plight seriously—and hard.

"And here I am," he continued as he slowly wrung his hands.

"Guess I'm in for it now. Farm life was too common.

"A fellow's got to have some fun in the world.

"I met Gau playing pool in Worland and we took up."

And he sighed.

But Gau—he stages the hardened criminal role.

"Aw, I've pulled 'em before," he growled as he spat viciously.

But beyond that he refuses to talk. His identity and past life will never be known if he can help it.

County authorities are not inclined to believe his statement that he had "pulled 'em before." They believe this to be his first.

Complaints charging robbery were prepared yesterday against the two youths by County Attorney Shotwell.

Yoss and Gau were arraigned in county court yesterday morning and waived preliminary hearing. They will stand trial on charges of burglary Monday morning in District Judge Troup's court.

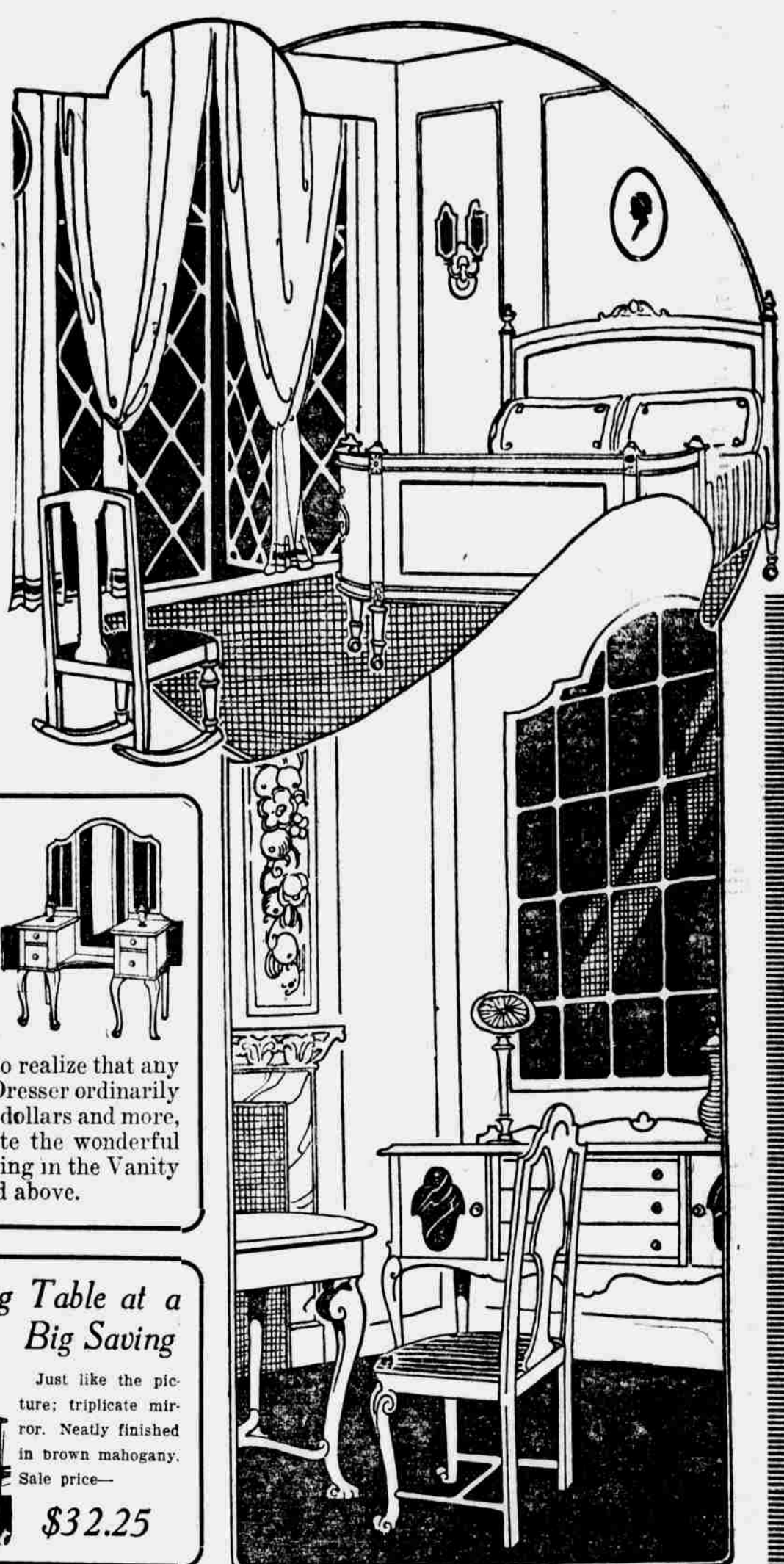

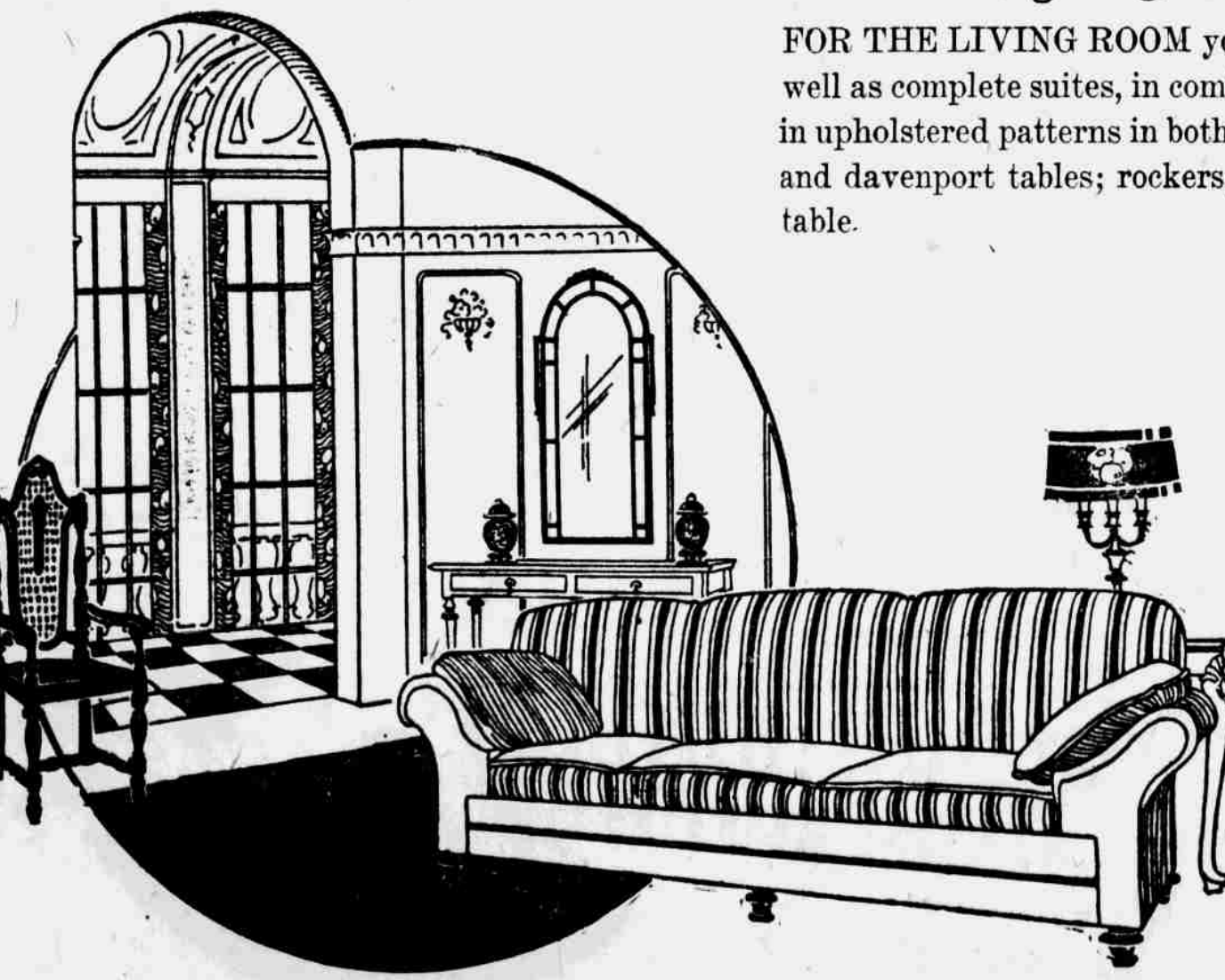
