

FORMER HEAD OF OMAHA SCHOOLS PAYS VISIT HERE

W. M. Davidson Now Superintendent at Pittsburgh—Surprises 3,000 Teachers.

W. M. Davidson, former superintendent of public schools here, and now superintendent of the public schools at Pittsburgh, Pa., made a hurried visit here yesterday afternoon on his way home from the National Education association meeting at Salt Lake City.

Mr. Davidson left here nine years ago, going to Washington, D. C., for two years and thence to the Keystone state city, where he has been seven years.

Time has dealt gently with the former Omaha educator, who now has a teaching staff of 3,000 under his supervision.
