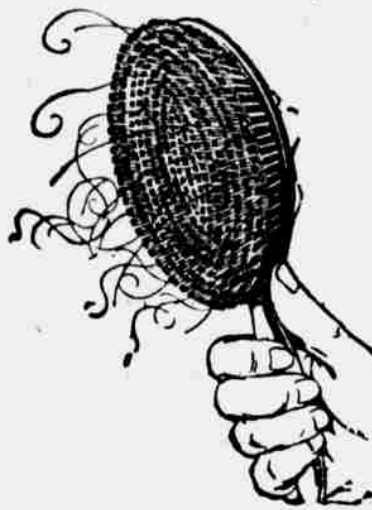


**Abdullah Effendi Quits;**

## MAY SAVE SIGHT OF MAN SHOT BY HIS SOULMATE

**Surgeons Say Bullet Crease  
In Optic Nerve Will Im-  
pair Vision Perma-  
nently, However.**

Chicago, July 20.—Miss Pauline Meglitsch's intentions were as unswerving as her affections, but her aim was not. That explains why she is dead and Julius Jonas, her wounded soulmate, stands a chance to recover. It is now hoped to save his sight, which surgeons yesterday feared had been permanently destroyed by the bullet which creased his optic nerve. Specialists this afternoon said they were hopeful of saving one eye and perhaps both, although Jonas' vision will always be impaired.

Jonas today was able to give his version of the tragedy which sent a bullet crashing into his head from the trembling hand of his "soul mate," but whose nerves were steady enough when she slew herself, fully believing her suitor was dead. He explained that he was starting on a trip for his firm and Pauline telephoned him that she was ill and must see him. He went to her home and she insisted upon talking it all over—his announced decision that he intended to return to his wife and family. She appeared reconciled to this and he retired for the night in a rear room.

"She came into my room, I think it was about 6 o'clock," said Jonas, "and sat on the side of the bed—and then the pistol went off. I don't remember but one shot—I was too blinded and dizzy."

Mrs. Barbara Meglitsch, mother of the dead woman, and Mrs. Helen Sander, a married sister, were the principal witnesses at the inquest. The mother insisted positively that

## FOOD PRICES IN OMAHA IN JUNE WENT SKYWARD

**Detroit and Portland, Ore.,  
Only Other Two Cities  
Showing 5 Per Cent In-  
crease Last Month.**

Washington, July 20.—Retail food prices continue to show "a steady increase," according to a survey of the food budget of the average family for June, made public today by the bureau of statistics of the Department of Labor. An advance of 2 per cent was noted on June 15 over prices on the same day of the month before. This was an increase of 9 per cent since the first of the year.

Prices increased in 39 cities under observation and decreased in 12. Increases observed were 5 per cent in Detroit, Omaha and Portland, Ore.; 4 per cent in Boston, Indianapolis, Kansas City, Manchester, Scranton, Seattle and Springfield, Ill.; 3 per cent in Bridgeport, Conn., Chicago, Denver, Milwaukee, Peoria, Pittsburgh, Portland, Me., St. Louis and St. Paul; 2 per cent in Cleveland, Columbus, Fall River, Minneapolis, Newark, New York and Providence, and 1 per cent in Birmingham, Butte, Los Angeles, Louisville, Memphis, New Haven, Richmond, Rochester, Salt Lake City and San Francisco.

In Baltimore and Washington the increase was less than 5-10 of 1 per cent.

Only two cities, Los Angeles and Jacksonville, showed less than 100 per cent increases since 1913. De-

troit topped the list with an increase of 139 per cent.

A decrease of 5 per cent for the month was noted in Houston, Tex.; 3 per cent in Jacksonville; 2 per cent in Atlanta and Mobile; 1 per cent in Charleston, Cincinnati, Little Rock, New Orleans and Norfolk, and less than 5-10 of 1 per cent in Dallas, Philadelphia and Savannah.

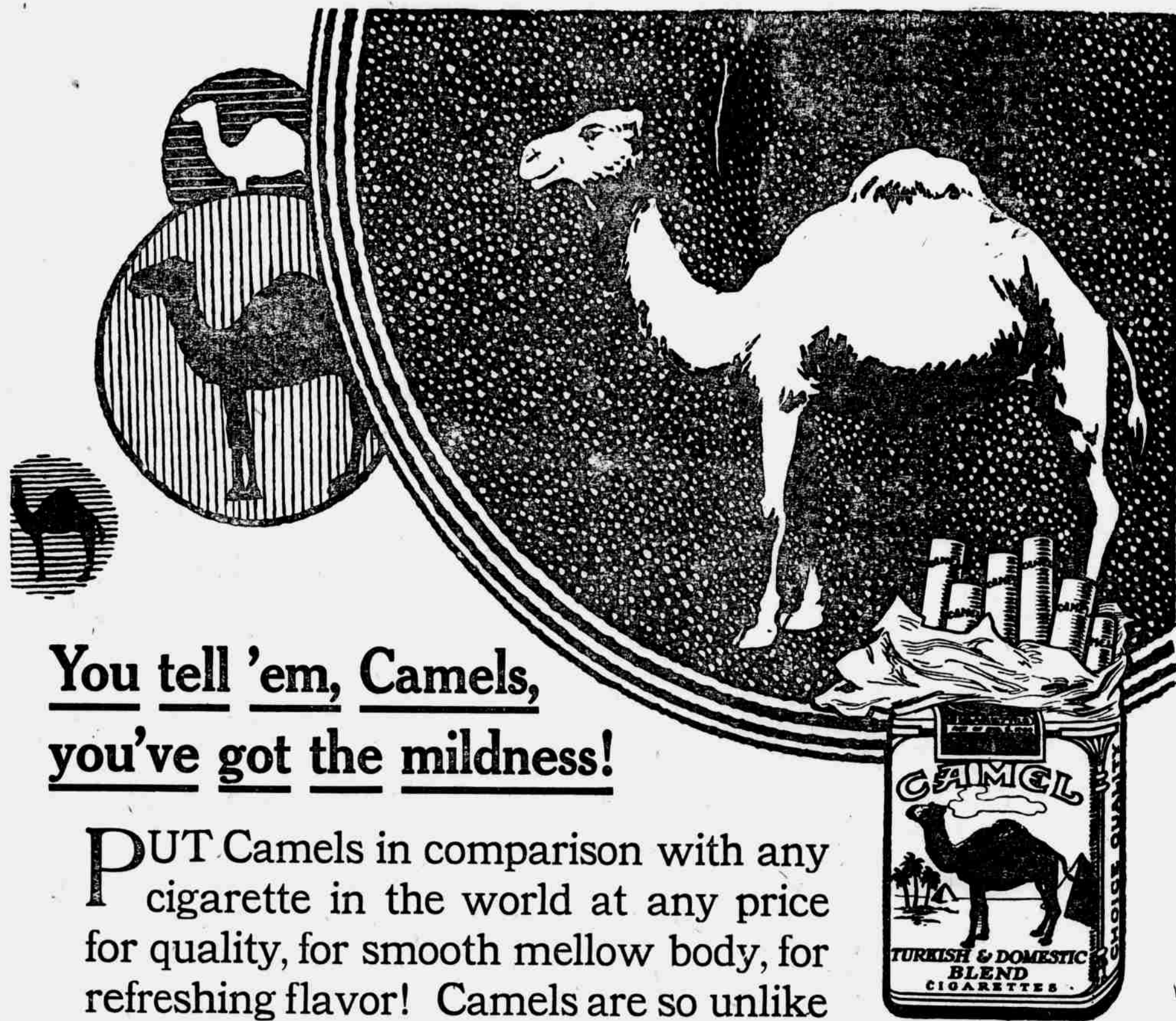
