IDEAL WORKING CONDITIONS IN FARRELL PLANT

Daylight Structure Equipped With Many Labor-Saving Machines — Shower Baths for Employees.

In point of convenience and equipment, the new plant of Farrell & Co., situated at Ninth and Dodge streets, is perhaps the most modern in Omaha.

The building is absolutely fireproof, built throughout of reinforced concrete, no wood being used in any part of the construction. It is a strictly day-light structure, large windows admitting an abundance of sunlight and fresh air.

Shower baths for all employees are another feature of the up-to-date equipment which makes ideal working conditions.

The plant is equipped on all six of its floors with the gravity system for handling materials from the time they enter the factory until they are ready to be loaded on cars.

Labor has been saved and production increased by the installation of new machinery for packing, eliminating all hand work.

The entire process of turning raw products into appetizing syrups is handled by elaborate equipment in this Omaha plant. Even the shipping boxes and crates are made in the smaller building.

There are adequate track spurs facing two sides of the main building, facilitating the rapid handling of in and out-going material large storage rooms for coal and oil have been constructed in the basement.

All liquids are moved through the plant by a battery of high pressure pumps. Electrical equipment of the latest and best type has been installed for power purposes on all floors.

Sees Five-Legged Toad; Didn't Touch a Drop
