- 1. Why the proportion of under-nourished children is greater in the country than in the city? 2. The best way to mix mustard at home? 3. An easy way to clean and brighten windows? (These questions will be answered this week by the Housekeeper.)

- 1. Rice at 17 cents a pound is cheaper than potatoes at 10 because potatoes are four-fifths water to one-fifth food material, while rice is about four-fifths food to one-fifth water. 2. Clean clams thoroughly with a brush, and place on hinges on a pan in oven with a very little water in bottom. The liquor may be used if opened in this way. 3. To remove paint from clothing rub immediately with spirits of turpentine. If not successful at first, repeat.

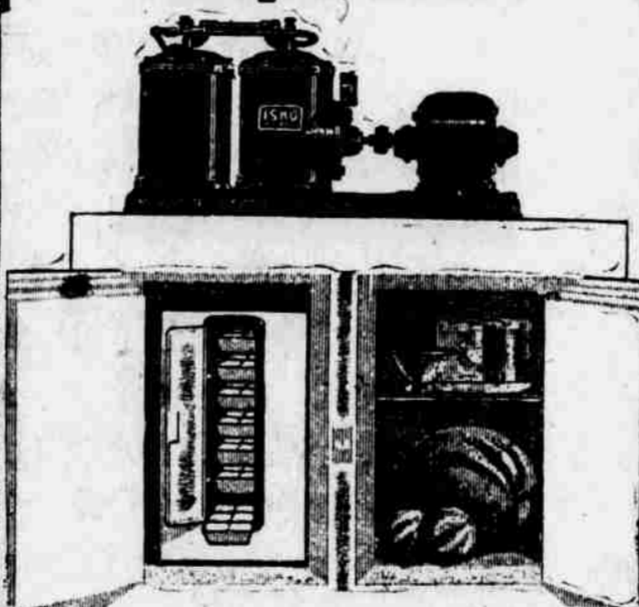

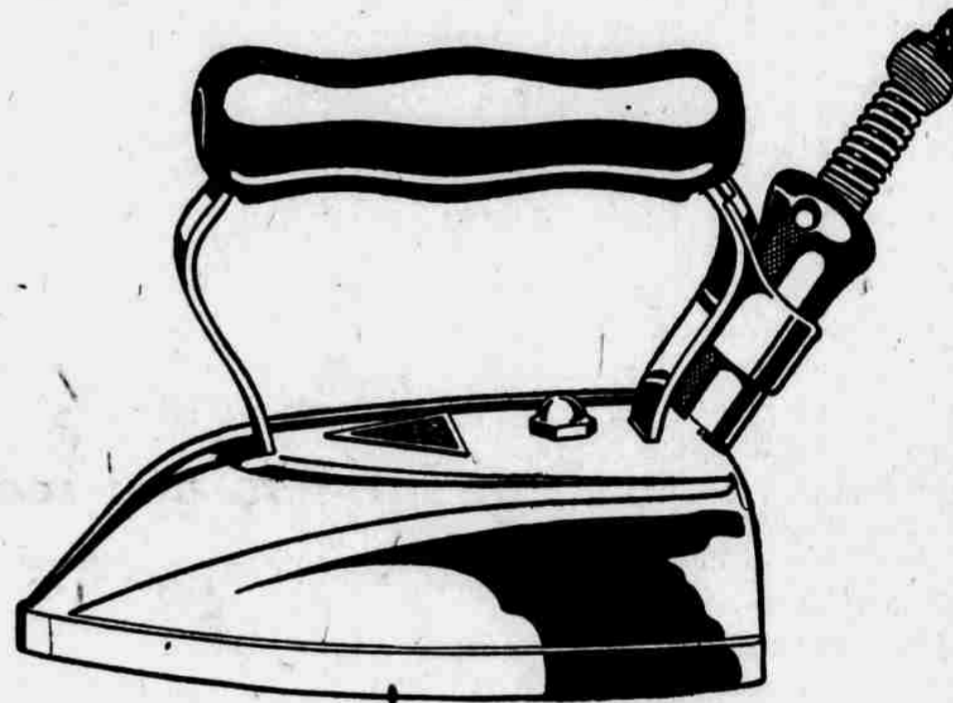
