

CHIEF SLATED FOR DISCARD HAS AN ATTORNEY ON JOB

Eberstein Asks Federal Officer to Watch Developments Among His "Goat Getters."

Chief of Police Marshall Eberstein, who is spending his vacation at Climax, Mich., requested Frank Peterson, United States district attorney, by telegraph yesterday to "look after his interests here until September 1," when he plans to return.

Mr. Peterson has not outlined the action which the chief expects him to take in the ouster proceedings started in the city hall. He declared yesterday he believed the resolution asking the chief's resignation was the organized effort on the part of "old leaders to stage a comeback."

Indications are that the resolution for the chief's resignation will be voted on by the council meeting as a committee of the whole, Monday morning. Mayor Smith, however, has expressed a desire to delay the vote until the return of Eberstein. Commissioner Butler yesterday announced he would vote against the resolution, thus participating a possible deadlock in the absence of Commissioner Ure. Commissioner Zimmerman, author of the resolution predicted that it would carry despite Butler's unfavorable vote.
