5 SAILORS ARE SHOT WHEN THEY STORM CITY JAIL

Hundreds of Service Men Attack the Police When Their Comrade Is Arrested.

Revere, Mass., Aug. 9.—Five sailors were severely wounded and a score of men received minor injuries in a battle at Revere Beach last night between Metropolitan Park police who were barricaded in the police station and several hundred attacking sailors, marines and soldiers.

The battle, precipitated by the attempt of a police officer to arrest a sailor on a charge of drunkenness, raged two hours and was only quelled when troops sailed and opened fire on the police station.
