Polish Americans of the three south Omaha parishes, as well as the 15 parishes out in the state, comprising a total of 20,000 Polish citizens, are to revive immediately the financial drive for the sale of bonds of the Polish republic, in accordance with a request from the national committee in Washington. The campaign was conducted July 4. 5 and 6 and then was permitted to drop. Its revival is due to the new conditions which have appeared in Poland, with the advance of the Russian bolsheviki into that country and the disasters which are threatening the republic of Poland. The campaign will continue until August 20.




