

Rourke's Snow Under By Nine to Three Score

OMAHA WALLOPS JOPLIN; PLATTE GETS HOME RUN

Schatzman Hurts Good Ball For Rourke's; Lee Stars in Garden—Double-Header Today.

Pa Rourke's hopefuls took a firmer grip on first place in the Western league pennant scramble yesterday by trimming the Joplin Miners, 9 to 3, in the first game of the series, incidentally shaking the pine that has been bothering Earl Schatzman for sometime.

Manager Jack Leivell's tribesmen began early and kept pegging away at Roy Sanders until they accumulated a total of 12 safeties. Schatzman held the visitors to one line single in three rounds, but in the fourth frame he began to find him and staged a rally that would have been worth something but for the lead the Rourke's already had established. Schatzman tightened up after the Miners crossed the rubber twice and put the kibosh on the assaults of the Hamilton players for the remainder of the contest.

Platte Gets Homer. Fred Haney, Al Platte and Cyrus Lingle carried the heavy artillery. Platte led all the rest with a double and a home run in four trips to the plate. The husky Omaha rightfielder whanged out his fifteenth homer of the season in the seventh stanza, scoring Haney and Glaslon ahead of him. Lamb and Wagner pulled the heavy hitting stuff for the visitors. Both players smacked the sphere for doubles. Billy Lee nailed drive off Sanders in the fourth inning that caused the spectators to exercise their vocal chords.

Schatzman had splendid support from his teammates, or it might have been tough going. The Miners made three bobbles during the contest. The Omahans got the jump on the visitors in the fourth inning because of three singles, a double and a base on balls. Lingle blazed the way for rallies by a single over first and hobbled to second when Schatzman stared the big brother stiff. Sacrificing. Haney doubled, but single stopped at the third sack. Weidell filled the bags when he drew a base on balls and Glaslon forced the Rourke backstop at the plate. Platte smacked the ball for a double and Haney and Weidell trotted across the rubber for Omaha's first tallies. Glaslon counted on a wild pitch and Platte boosted the local score to four runs when he registered on Leivell's single. The manager attempted to pick a double into a triple and a strike was what he nabbed the third sack.

Miners Rally in Fourth. With the score 4 to 0, against 'em, the Miners rallied early to tie the count in their half of the inning. Dunn responded with a single, but Sanders was an easy out and Roberson was robbed of a possible double when Lee scaled the left field boards after a high ball. Lamb, the former University of Nebraska athlete, doubled over second, scoring Dunn.

Three singles and a walk resulted in one for Omaha in the fourth when Mason singled, went to third when Schatzman singled and scored on Weidell's hit over first base.

Hamilton's men fought hard to trim the Rourke's in the fourth. Sneedor, the first man up, lied out, but Wolfer singled and scored on Wagner's double to left. Yockey followed with a single to right and Wagner scored the Miners' final tally.

The Rourke's gained another four laps in the seventh when Haney started the fireworks with a single, taking second when Weidell grounded out. Glaslon sloughed a single over Yockey's head, and both Rourke's came home when Platte smacked out his fifteenth homer of the season over the right field fence. Leivell got on first when Roberson fumbled the ball and went to second when Yockey made an error, scoring on Mason's long sacrifice fly.

Two Games Today. Only one Miner reached second in the last five innings and Schatzman allowed the visitors but two hits during that period.

The same two teams will meet in a doubleheader at Rourke park this afternoon, the first contest starting at 2:15. Another double bill will be on the program for Wednesday afternoon.

Emilo Palmero, Cuban hurler, may be able to hurl one of today's games. The star Rourke pitcher has had foot and is hardly able to walk.
