How to Register
Compiled for Woman's Home Companion by Anna Steese Richardson.

Friday, September 10, is the last registration day for the special election in Nebraska on September 21 when 41 proposed constitutional amendments will be voted on. The following general information with practical application to Omaha added by Louise Cotter of the Bee, may therefore be of special interest at this time:

1. What is meant by registering for elections? Ordinarily registering means that you, as a voter, will appear at an authorized place on an authorized day, to register your name and address, and to furnish other information required of you, to establish yourself as an elector or voter at the next election.
2. Why is this registration necessary? To prevent fraud. If voters were not required to register, their residence address, occupation, etc., would have to be ascertained from women who would go from polling place to another, voting many times for the candidates they wished to elect. Registration is one check on election fraud.
3. What information will be required of me if I register for the first time? Answer—Your full name, residence address, occupation, your age, or a statement as to whether you are a native born or will be that age on or before election day, whether you are a native born or naturalized citizen of the United States; your place of birth, and the date of your naturalization papers or copies thereof.
4. How long must I have lived in the state and in the election district or precinct to vote? The answer varies in different states. In New York you must have lived in the state one year, in the county four months, in the district 30 days previous to election day. In Iowa you must have lived in the state six months, in the precinct of voting district 60 days. In making this calculation figure on the time previous to election day, not registration day. Your own state election laws will define the terms "residence" and the length of time you have resided at this address necessary before you can register for elections.
5. How often must I register? Answer: This answer also depends upon the state or local rulings. In Illinois, for example, you must register every two years. Consult your state election laws, but take no chances.
6. If I am out of town or ill on registration day, can anyone register for me? Answer: In some communities, yes. In certain states, no. In others, you can register your name; in other states party workers register for you.
7. If I am out of town or ill or should I forget to register on any of the prescribed dates, is there any other way to remember the registration dates and register them? Answer: Yes, in some states, but it is a complicated process. You must swear in your vote, which must be affirmed by witnesses as to your identity, residence, etc., or by affidavit. It is far simpler to remember the registration dates and register them.
8. Is there more than one registration day and why? Answer: In most states there are three registration days, rather close together, preceding each election. This plan is for the benefit of voters who may be ill or called away on the first date named.
9. (As applied to Omaha: The election commissioner's office in Omaha registers voters on the election day of the state and on the election day of the county. If you move after registration, will I lose my vote? Answer: If you move out of the state or your election district, yes. If you move to another house in the election district, you do not lose your vote. If you know that you will move some time between the day you register and election day you must so advise the registration officer in writing. If you move suddenly between the date of registration and election day you can advise the election
