

3 Armed Bandits Hold Up and Rob Carnival Couple

Man and Woman Victims of Highwaymen in Wild Night of Crime in Omaha.

Arthur Dalton and Anita Lee, members of the Con T. Kennedy shows on the King's Highway of the Ak-Sar-Ben fall festival, while going to their sleeping car at Sixteenth and Nicholas streets Friday night, were held up by three armed bandits who robbed Dalton of \$30 and Miss Lee of \$18, according to police reports.

Dalton told police the bandits each carried a revolver and berated them for being show people "coming into Omaha with lots of dough anyway."

Two More Suits Filed Against Cattle Company

Directors and officers of the Missouri Valley Cattle Loan company are in federal court again on a charge of fraudulent sale of stock and securities.

Yesterday Attorney Charles A. Sunderlin, representing the law firm of Corey and Sunderlin, filed in federal court two separate actions in the sum of \$21,250,000 each for Joseph Wood and John Peters of Irwin, Ia., creditors of the company, against the officers and directors of the firm for deceit, misrepresentation and fraud perpetrated upon them in the disposal of alleged securities and stocks of the company.

Demos Prepare For Reception In City for Cox

On Account of Candidate's Throat Trouble Instructions Issued to Keep Crowds Away.

W. H. Thompson of Grand Island, democratic national committeeman for Nebraska, advises that Governor Cox will arrive at North Platte, Neb., from the west at 8 a. m. September 27.

The democratic presidential candidate will deliver short talks from the rear platform of his coach at North Platte, Lexington, Kearney and Grand Island. The three stopovers of the governor's party will be transferred from the Union Pacific to the Burlington at Grand Island at 12:45 noon. The itinerary then calls for short speeches at Aurora, York and Seward, arriving at Lincoln, where an address will be delivered in the Auditorium.

Keep Crowds Away

The governor is scheduled to leave Lincoln at 6 p. m., arriving in Omaha at 7:45, for an address in the Auditorium here. Mr. Thompson and Keith Neville, former governor, will meet the train at North Platte. Thomas C. Grimes, A. P. Sprague and John H. Morehead also will be with Governor Cox during the Nebraska itinerary.

Governor Cox recently was reported to be suffering from speaker's laryngitis and in that connection Pat Harrison, chairman of the democratic speakers' bureau, has transmitted special instructions for observance.

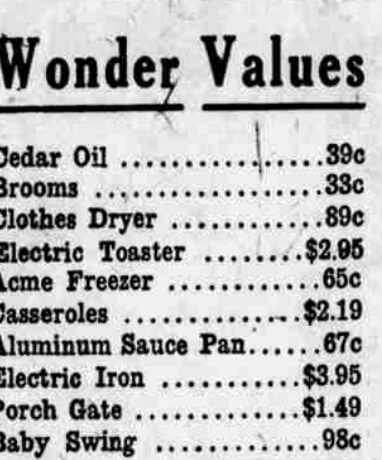

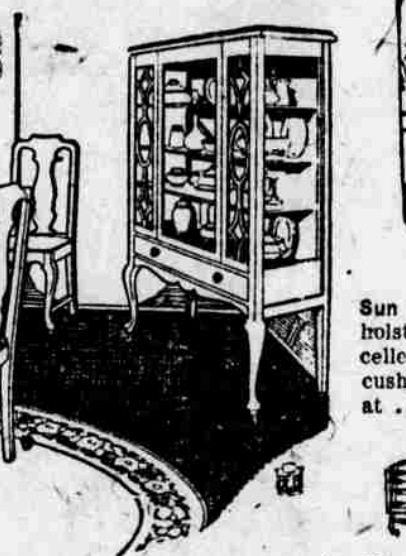

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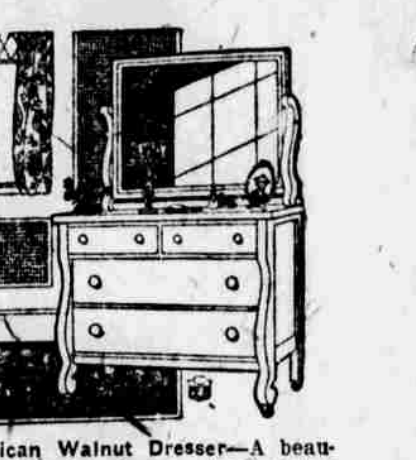
