

### Transportation By Water Subject Of Chicago Meet

Possibilities of Mississippi Valley and Great Lakes to Receive Particular Attention at Convention.

Chicago, Sept. 29.—Water transportation, particularly from the standpoint of harbor development, will be taken up here at the ninth annual convention of the American Association of Port Authorities opening tomorrow. Mississippi valley waterways and the possibilities of the Great Lakes will receive much attention.

Progress that Canada is making in port improvement will be told by Canadian officials, the association being international. American development from New York to San Francisco is scheduled for relation. A large part of the program is given over to reports on what individual cities are doing with their water opportunities. Chicago's possibilities as a port will receive consideration.

Papers will be presented by members of the Western Society of Engineers and of the Society of Terminal Engineers, New York. "Nations' Preparations for Deep Water Harbors on the Great Lakes" is scheduled for discussion by Col. John Mills, corps of engineers, U. S. A. William H. Adams, chairman of the committee on inland waterways of the Detroit Board of Trade, is to tell of what has been done in "modernizing the old city from its port purposes" at Detroit. William George Bruce, president of the Milwaukee harbor commission, will speak of "Essentials of Lake Erie Port Development." On the Canadian side, E. L. Cousins, chief engineer of the Toronto harbor commission, is to tell of the port of Toronto.

Gulf points will be represented by Capt. B. C. Allen, director of the port of Houston, Tex., speaking on "Gulf Terminal Study."

One of the early papers of the convention, which is to continue through Saturday, is by John H. McCullum, president of the state harbor commission of San Francisco. His subject is "The Harbor, San Francisco's Greatest Asset." A. K. Smith of New York is to speak later on "The Port of New York, the Greatest Port in the World." Addresses relative to the ports of Philadelphia, New Orleans, Portland, Ore., Wilmington, Del., and Norfolk, Va., are among others to be given.

R. Dawson Harling, Canadian representative of the Manchester Ship Canal company, is on the program for an address on the "Port of Manchester, England." Other Canadian port authorities are to tell of the ports at Vancouver, Halifax, Victoria and St. John, N. B.

### Film Star of Early Days Kills Himself By Use of Strychnine

New York, Sept. 29.—His day as a movie star done, deserted by his wife and child, broke and despondent, Ned Finley committed suicide today by taking cyanide and strychnine. About a decade and a half ago, when the film first took the imagination of the theater-going public, Ned Finley was the "Bill Hart" of his day. For 17 years he lived on an income that ranged between \$1,000 and \$2,000 a week.

As the years went by other stars crowded the old timers out of the focus and Ned Finley experienced one reverse after another. Early today he took an inventory. He was 48 years old and passed as an actor. His wife had left him a year ago to live in Salem, Va.

He had just a few pennies and a countless number of pawn tickets. The money he invested in cyanide and strychnine. He went to his room in a hotel, undressed, wrote a few letters and took the poison.
