# **Edison Working** Talk With Dead Cox Makes Early Morning

Hopes to Perfect Instrument Delicate Enough to Be Manipulated by Personality in Next Life.

Chicago Tribune-Omaha Bee Leased Wire New York. Oct. 1 .- Thomas A. Edison is now at work on a delicate tiens. apparatus, which he has designed to effect indisputable communication between those whom death has removed from this earth and those who yet live.

It is Mr. Edison's hope to complete the instrument within a few months and he himself realizes what a tremendous sensation it would create should it prove to be successful. He says he would not be surprised if responses on his new apparatus should first come from telegraphers or scientists of those thoroughly familiar with the use of delicate instruments and electric cur

Announcement of Mr. Edison's experiment is made by B. C. Forbes in an article in the American magazine for October, in which he quotes the inventor at length respecting the ap-paratus. Mr. Edison, however, does not disclose anything of the character or physical aspect of his new

"I am proceeding," Mr. Edison says in the article, "on the theory that in the very nature of things the degree of material or physical power possessed by those in the next life must be extremely slight, and that, therefore, any instrument designed o communicate with us must superdelicate-as fine and responsive as human ingenuity can make it. "For my part, I am inclined to be-

lieve that our personality hereafter will be able to affect matter. If this reasoning be correct, then if we can evolve an instrument so delicate as to be affected, or moved or manipulated-whichever term you want to use-by our personality as it survives in the next life, such an instrument, when made available, ought to record something." Mr. Edison, commenting upon the

mass of material being written these days about spiritualism, says that "the methods and apparatus commonly used are just a lot of un-scientific nonsense."

### Smith Objected To Clemency by War Secretary

Lieutenant Convicted of Brutal Treatment of Soldiers Wished to Serve Full 18 Months' Term.

Washington, Oct. 1.-Lieut. Frank H. (Hard Boiled) Smith. whose release from imprisonment following conviction by army court-martial of brutal treatment of American soldiers in France, has just become known, objected to any clemency being extended him, Sec-retary of War Baker said today. Smith's commanding officers, the secretary said, had appealed to the clemency board of the War department for a reduction of the 18 months' sentence. Smith, learning of the action, wrote the board objecting to any change, saying that he wished to serve out his sentence to avoid further publicity.

A War department statement ex-plained that Smith was at liberty because the sentence given him by court-martial had expired. His imprisonment began at Fort Jay, New York, on July 21, 1919, the statement said, and continued until March 20, 1920, when, because of good conduct, he was granted a parole. He was released from parole July 28, when the reduced sentence expired.
