OU can find material for sleight of hand trick in almost anything that comes your way. A book of matches, such as the clerk in your favorite cigar store may or may not be glad to give you, provides material for a puzzling trick that very few people know.

Each match usually has advertising matter printed on one side, the other side being plain. Tear out two of them and hold them as in the illustration, printed side up.

"You see," you explain, "there is printing on this side and (turning the hand over) there is printed matter on the other side." The hand is turned over several



times to show that there is printed matter on each side.

You then blow on the matches. "You see, the printed matter has vanished from this side and from this side also." The hand is turned over several times to show that both sides of the matches are free from the ad-

vertising matter. The secret is this. As you turn the hand over, press with the thumb toward the tip of the forefinger. This will turn or roll the matches over. The movement will be entirely covered by the natural turning of the hand. In turning the hand the second time, draw the thumb back, reversing the motion used in the first place. To show the matches plain, turn the hand without rolling the matches. To show "the other side plain" roll the matches as before. (Copyright, 1920, Thompson Feature

Is "Horse-Radish So Called? The prefix "horse" is one which has come to be commonly applied to vegetables, plants, nuts, etc., of a coarse or rank variety. in order to distinguish them from species of a finer texture. Thus we have horse-radish, in contradistinction to the ordinary radish; horse-chestnut, instead of the finer-grained chestnut, and

The same prefix is also frequently applied in the case of animals or shell-fish—as, or example, "horse-leech," "horseample, "horse-leech," "horse-crab" and "horse-mussel," in all of which there is a coarse re-semblance to the varieties which bear the simple name, unprefixed. For the same reason 'horse" is placed in front of some words in order to designate rough or uncouth habits or conduct. "Horse-play" and "horse-laugh" are two of the outstanding representatives of this class. Etymologists who have looked nto the mater state that there is no definite explanation of the reason for the "horse" prefix, but that it is probably a corrup-tion of the wird "coarse," (Copyright, 1920, By the Wheeler Syndicate, Inc.)
