

Court Gives Mrs. Lindsay Divorce, Child and Alimony
 Mrs. Helen F. Lindsay was granted a divorce yesterday from James W. Lindsay by District Judge Sears. He also granted her custody of a child, 5 years old. Lindsay is ordered to pay his wife \$2,500 alimony in installments of \$25 a month and to pay an additional \$25 a month for the support of the child.
 When James lost his job with the postoffice department in August he enlisted in the navy and without saying anything to his wife, departed. Charges that he had no "stability" and liked the dance halls too much were filed against him and he was brought back.
