

Wife of Eckman Gives Details of Deathbed Will

Doctor Testifies That Omahan Was Suffering From Disease; Apartment Owner Says Man "Liked Booze."

Three signing of a will by the late E. W. Eckman, as he lay upon his deathbed in a summer cottage near Minneapolis, was related on the witness stand in county court yesterday afternoon by Mrs. Glendora Petty Eckman.

Mr. Eckman married the nurse while the two of them were on a motor trip through Minnesota. He died August 9, just a month and a week after he married her. He made a will, leaving his entire \$75,000 estate to her.

His two stepdaughters, Mrs. Emmet Hannon and Mrs. F. C. Henry are seeking to break the will.

Taken Violently Ill

Mrs. Eckman said her husband was taken very ill on August 1. At 2:30 the morning of August 5, he awoke in terrible pain, called for a doctor and for B. T. Downes. He dictated a will to the latter and signed it. A hypodermic injection was given him right after he signed the will, but not before he signed, Mrs. Eckman declared.

Dr. G. W. Dishong, who examined Eckman four months before his death, testified that he was then suffering from a social disease but that he might have lived for years if he had taken care of himself.

Met Eckman as Nurse

M. Tuchman said that "Eckman liked the booze," and E. W. Elwood, owner of the Elwood apartments, told of being invited to drink with Eckman.

Mrs. Eckman testified that she is 36 and Eckman was 46 years old. She said she first met him when she was his nurse during illness at his palatial apartment in the Elwood, 17th and Dodge streets, where he lived with a Japanese servant.

Their marriage, she said took place at Worthington, Minn., in the course of a motor trip from Omaha to Minneapolis.

Eckman sold a new compound called "Killabug," on the way, she said. He sold some of the bug-killer at the Casan Hotel, St. Paul, Minn., where they stopped.

Gasoline Output Record Was Broken in September

Washington, Nov. 22.—All gasoline output records were broken during September, the bureau of mines announced. Refineries produced a daily average of 15,000,000 gallons, making the output total for the first nine months of 1920 3,500,000,000 gallons as compared with 2,900,000,000 gallons during the same period in 1919.

Consumption and exports continued high, however, the bureau said, so that while storage tanks on September 30, held 208,000,000 gallons, the amount on hand then was actually less than that on hand August 30.

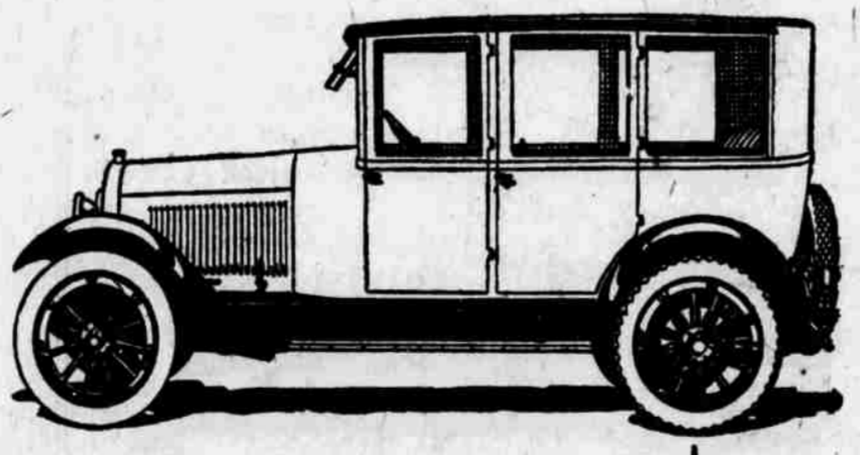
