

Club to Sponsor Girls' League

Omaha "Lions" Decide to Stand Back of Community Service Organization.

Members of the Lions club voted at a business meeting in the Rome hotel yesterday to sponsor the Omaha Girls' community service league.

Decision came as a result of a committee investigation into the work of the girls' community league, which has taken over the War Camp Community building at Seventeenth street and St. Mary's avenue.

The committee made a report of its findings, stating that it was favorably impressed because the girls were to be independent and refuse to accept charity.
