Washington, Dec. 14.—The state of Nebraska filed a brief with the interstate commerce commission today objecting to the proposal of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad that it be permitted to distribute \$140,000,000 of its surplus in stock dividends and in bonds as a cash dividend.

Alschuler Resigns Job as Arbitrator in Packing Cases

Chicago, Dec. 14.—Federal Judge Samuel Alschuler yesterday asked representatives of the packing companies to arrange to have him relieved as federal arbiter of their disputes, the position to which he was appointed by President Wilson in 1917. Judge Alschuler said he did not have time to attend to his bench duties, and settle packing company disputes, too.
