## 744 Members Gained In Fillmore County Farm Bureau Drive

Lincoln, Neb., Dec. 19.—(Special.)—Membership drives of the farm bureau of the farm bureau federation which are in progress this week in Fillmore, Cass and Frontier counties are moving along with a rush, according to reports reaching state headquarters in Lincoln. The reports indicate that these three counties are keeping up the average attained in the drives in the counties previously organized where approximately 90 per cent of the farmers signed up for membership.

Up to and including Thursday, Fillmore county reported 744 signed memberships; Cass county 672, and Frontier 550, with several precincts not reported in the latter county. At the close of this week the statewide membership campaign will close for the holidays, to be resumed on January 4. After the various state conventions of farm organizations have been held in Lincoln during the first week in January in connection with "organized agriculture" week.
