

### Five Armenian Waifs Adopted by Implement Men

Midwest Association Votes \$300 for Support of Orphans At Close of Convention In Omaha.

One of the last acts of the Midwest Implement Dealers' association, before it closed its convention here yesterday afternoon at the Rome hotel, was to adopt five little Armenian orphans and donate \$300 for their support for a year. The adoption of the children came as a response to a plea made to the dealers in their Friday morning session by Mrs. Katherine Reynolds McCormick, national speaker for the Near East Relief, to endorse a resolution to congress asking that the nation take a hand in preventing further outrages among the Christians in Armenia.

At the annual election Friday all officers were re-elected. They are Oscar A. Rystrom, St. Louis, Mo., president; C. E. Bue, Anselmo, Neb., vice president; J. M. Wallace, Council Bluffs, secretary, and J. M. Elwell, Springfield, Neb., treasurer. Members of the board of directors are P. B. Laird, Tabor, Ia.; J. Bender, Sutton, Neb., and August F. Zanzow, Central City, Neb.

The 1922 convention city was not selected as it will be chosen at the next called meeting of the board of directors. The dealers have been invited to select Omaha for 1922. At the morning meeting the association, in a resolution, went on record as opposed to any raise in the price of implements. The dealers also disapproved the shipping of repairs c. o. d., as being a reflection on the financial standing of the dealers and unbusinesslike. The association expressed itself as favorable to a standardization of parts for all implements. It endorsed the activities of the farm bureau and pledged its co-operation with the farmers in the future.

The dealers passed a resolution favoring a uniform sales contract, disapproved the priceless contract and condemned the habit of jobbers and manufacturers of sending out invoices for repairs several days after shipment had been made. Resolutions complimenting the Omaha and Council Bluffs Hardware, Implement and Tractor club, the Omaha Chamber of Commerce and Rome Miller for courtesies extended during the convention were passed unanimously.

### Case of Government Against C. L. Nethaway Continued by Judge

Federal Judge T. C. Munger continued the case of the government

against Claude L. Nethaway until next Tuesday in order to allow the defendant time to gather witnesses. Nethaway is charged with sending scurrilous matter through the mail. A question of whether Mrs. Stella Nethaway is still the wife of the defendant was brought up at the jury trial yesterday, when a motion was

made to place her on the witness stand. An objection was raised in that Mr. Nethaway appealed the divorce suit, filed by his wife in October, to the supreme court. "If Mrs. Nethaway is still the defendant's wife, the law will not allow her to testify against her husband," Federal Judge Munger ruled.

### Kiwanians Plan Hastings And Grand Island Trip

Kiwanians held a meeting in the Hotel Rome at noon yesterday to plan for the trip to Hastings and Grand Island, where Kiwanis chapters will be presented next Wednesday. The Kiwanis male quartet

made its first appearance at the meeting and was enthusiastically received. The Kiwanis orchestra, augmented by outsiders, gave a concert. At least 75 Omaha Kiwanians will make the trip to Hastings and Grand Island, it was announced. Dr. Ladd will be in charge of the trip.
