

**Melady Predicts** Return to Normal At Stock Yards

Commission Man Expects Livening Up in Stocker Trade, Due to Improved Financial Conditions.

"We have had numerous inquiries for stockers and feeders during the past week or 10 days, which is one of the most encouraging features of the live stock situation so far this year," said Gene Melady, commission man, at the stock yards, Thurs-

"I expect things to improve in the stocker trade very soon," continued Mr. Melady, "Our business has shown a decrease during the past few months, mainly on account of the tightness of money, but there are bright indications to a rapid return to normal conditions. A large number of our regular customers who have wanted stockers for feed ing have had empty feed lots, which I suppose was due to their inability to get financial aid. I expect these people to be in the market for large orders for stockers and feeders and we have had a large number of inquiries as to the availability of get

ting stock. Financial Condition Better. "We are receiving a large number of letters intimating that the writers' home banks are in a better condition to place feeding loans and that money is becoming easier to borrow. The probability of a shortage and the low price of feed are both fac-

tors favoring an impetus in the feed ers and stock trade." Charles Burwell came O'Neill yesterday with a load of fat steers for the local market and he said the financial situation as it arfects the farmer and live stock grower was most encouraging and

had passed the crisis. Farmers Meeting Obligations .. "Farmers in my locality are said to be able to meet their obligations to a satisfactory degree with the banks, according to bankers of our section. There is a general move-ment of farm products and bankers have shown a willingness to make loans. As a result of our experience during the past few years I am of the opinion the average farmer will take advantage of the knowledge gained and pay more aftention to figuring his cost of production and try to decrease his overhead expenses rather than to attempt to

force the consumer to pay for mis-takes of the farmer." Wife's Plea Saves Husband From Jail
