# Forteit Moneys of Both Dempsey and Carpentier Accounted For

### Contract for Title Battle **Not Violated**

Heavyweight Championship Fight Will Be Held July 2 -Each Principal Has Posted \$50,000.

New York, Jan. 19 .- The forfeit moneys of both principals and promoters involved in the Dempsey-Carpentier heavyweight championship bout set for July 2 were directly or indirectly accounted for today. As a result, it appeared that none of the terms of the contract signed November 5 have been violated and so far as can be foreseen there is no ground for the report that the match will not be held.

J. E. Ward, a surety broker who handled the bonds for those involved in the contract, stated that the American Security company had issued a bond for Promoter Tex Rickard's share of the \$100,000 forfeit fund amounting to \$33,333.33. The United States Fidelity and Guaranty company of Baltimore issued a similar bond for Wm. A. Brady, while Charles B. Cochran, English promoter, gave a check for his one-third responsibility.

Each principal through his manager was obliged by the contract to place a forfeit fund of \$50,000 with the holding trust company on or before November 20. Dempsey's manager, Jack Kearns, arranged with the Fidelity and Deposit company of Baltimore for such a bond. Carpentier placed a sum equivalent to \$50,000 with the Paris firm of Morgan Harjes, with instructions to forward it to New York. According to a cable from Paris this amount was deposited November 22 and in a statement from Cochran in London it was explained that the money had never been transferred to this country owing to refusal of the French government to permit it to leave. 


