> Gompers Says Labor Will Oppose Bill Unless Trades Unions Are Excluded From Regulation.

Washington, Feb. 10. - Unless rades unions are "affirmatively and definitely" excluded from the Calder bill for government regulation of the coal industry, organized labor's op-position to it will be unyielding, Samuel Gompers told a senate committee. His statement, together with prolonged and at times heated contest over an allegation by Represen-tative Huddleston, democrat, Ala-bama, that coal mine operators had indulged in "wholesale looting of the public" and that the National Coal association had something to do with REAL ESTATE TO EXCHANGE fixing the prices," took up the day.
