Easier Situation Predicted.

Perhaps the same comment should be made on the reserve bank position and the money market. Improvement in those directions had been confidently expected ever since New Year's day. The fact that the reserve system's present ratio of reserve should be nearly 5 per cent above the end of December, 7% per cent higher than a year ago and barely 2 per cent lower than in this week of 1919, before the wild infiation of credit had begun, speaks for itself. Money rates are still abnormally high, yet it may be as reasonable to infer from the reserve statements, a much easier situation not very far ahead, as it was to assume the bad industrial company reports from the visible trade conditions of last autumn. The present difficulty of measuring conditions arises, as it usually does from the fact that each favorable consideration is offset by some development in current finance. Money, for instance, is unmistakently easier than at the end of 1919, but on the other hand, there has been no such decline as was prophesied in New Year's week. The federal reserve position has steadily improved in curtaliment, of loans, reduction of outstanding notes and increase of reserve precentage, all such accounts are still above their total of a year age.

Foreign exchange has recovered in a highly reassuring way, yet it has been repeatedly checked by continuing confusion and doubt ever the German payments.
