

Mail Trucks to Be Soon in Service

Street Cars Used in Picking Up Mail to Be Discarded March 10.

Collection and delivery of mail by trucks in Omaha will be started on the morning of March 10, it was announced yesterday.

Special street cars used in picking up mail in suburban parts of the city will be discarded on that day. Twenty trucks are now ready for use, all new. Ten more trucks will be added.

L. H. Utt, who has been named superintendent of the truck system, plans to operate the trucks on 16-hour shifts. Headquarters for the system temporarily is at the Truck and Tractor corporation, 1310 Jackson street.

A large garage is being constructed for the government at Nineteenth and California streets, and the headquarters will be moved there on its completion, not later than July 1.

E. Hoel, chief mechanic, with a staff of three men, is responsible for keeping the trucks running on scheduled time. They will be operated systematically, dispatched at a fixed time, and returned to the garage on regular schedule.

Practice runs will be made by drivers beginning two days before the actual collection and delivery starts.
