

Reparation Big Problem of Day To Financiers

Indirect Results of Germany's Action on United States Cannot Be Determined at This Time.

Germany's indemnity or reparation and the determination of it are regarded here as the dominant problem of the day. For while the United States is not to share in any payment Germany may make, nevertheless the reparation exacted from her may play an important although indirect part in our entire international financial relations. Some think that it may seriously affect, if it be not a reasonable reparation, our foreign trade. It may interfere with the payment of the debts which the allies owe to the United States and to one another.

In a letter to C. D. Bedford, who is chairman of the board of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey, sent several weeks ago, he wrote there chiefly as the representative of the United States Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Bedford was invited to attend the meeting and spend an afternoon with the prime minister of France. He was accompanied by the prime minister of France, who was the representative of the French government. Mr. Bedford asked him why France was maintaining a standing army of 1,200,000 men, although the need was great for workers in the industries, in the transportation and in the other branches of the economy. The prime minister replied frankly saying that he was not in a position to maintain a standing army of 1,200,000 men, but that he was maintaining it because of the reparations which he was expected to pay to the United States.

The possibility of action of this kind by France is a very serious concern to leaders in the financial district and to investors in financial securities throughout the United States.
