> Guaranty Trust Passes High Water Mark in Deposits Which National City Held Long Time.

By HOLLAND. In earlier days it was the custom commonly followed in every banking office in New York eagerly to take up the daily sheet which told of clearing house transactions that morning so that it might be discovered whether any bank was gain-ing upon the Chemical or whether the Chemical was holding its own as the leader among the New York banks.

About 20 years ago that custom changed because no longer was the hemical foremost. City bank had secured that pre-eminnet position. At last the Guaranty Trust has attained supreme prestige, for it was reported the other day that it not passed the National City bank in the agregate amount of its deposits. Each of phem carries a deposit list which a few years ago would have been larger than the deposit list of 10 or 12 of the New York banks combined. Each of them has accumulated resources which nearly touch the billion deliar mark. The competition continues and probably will long continue, but it is a friendly competition because it is carried on in an open, even conspicuous

One of the visible evidences of it was the purchase by the Guaranty Trust of the large building upon upper Fifth avenue which was built for the purpose of giving to a famous caterer an opportunity for expansion.
