Suspension of Mining Affects

Entire Country-But Business Coming Back Declares Copper Magnate.

By HOLLAND. If Europe were now able to buy American copper the industry would be speedily restored. Its present collapse is, however, only tempor-

ary. One of those who are heavily interested in the copper industry and who returned yesterday to New York from a visit to the copper country, spoke with the authority

Copper Industry

He was asked if the organization recently perfected in the hope that t would be able to aid in the financing of heavy sales of copper to Europe had begun its contemplated work. He said that some delay has followed the organization. It is probably due, however, to the fear that this copper financing association would at the present time be unable to sell its debentures. had been the hope that it would be possible to market in the aggregate \$1,000,000,000 of the debentures.

So also one reason for the delay in per-fecting the Foreign Trade Financing cor-poration ts believed to be the apprehen-sion that not for some months will the debentures put out by this organization find a market. But the market is sure to be found sooner or later, Meanwalle, the depression in the copper industry and the difficulties associated with the mar-keting of our American products in Europe continue.

continue.

The Southern Pacific and Other Railroads.

The suspension of the copper mining industry which is represented by about three-fourths of the corporations engaged in that industry will bear heavily of course, upon the many thousands who work in the copper mines. They will be unable to buy commodities or at least their purchases will be curtailed. But the Southern Pacific railroad and other railroads are likely to be seriously affected by the suspension of the copper mining industry. One of the chief items in the traffic carried by the Southern Pacific has been copper so much of which is mined in the Southern Pacific railroad district. In normal times this railroad has transported in regularly sustained traffic, large amounts of copper from the copper country to the east. It has for instance carried many thousand pounds to the American Brass company, which is the largest single corporation in the world so far as the purchase of copper is concerned.

But while the Southern Pacific has found profitable traffic in the transportation of copper from the mines to the markets, it has not been obliged to bring back empty cars to the copper district. Its return freight consisted of oil, supplies of many kinds, machinery and other commodities which are needed in the copper districts.

Now with the suspension of this industry this heavy traffic is for a time at least ended. Arizona is chiefly a copper producing state. It has furnished a large traffic to the Southern Pacific and to some other railroads. Now for a time this traffic is gone. It is a new complication which the railroad companies of the United States or some of them are now compelled to face.

In The Lake District The Southern Pacific and Other Railroads

In The Lake District What is true of the Southern Pacific so far as copper transportation is concerned is also true of that great and wonderful producer of copper which is known as the Lake district. Already discoveries have been made of new large copper veins in that district. It was the first of the great copper poducing properties of the United States. But it cannot now sell its United States. But it cannot now sell its copper excepting at a loss and not much of any of its copper to Europe which formerly was a large purchaser of the products of the Lake copper district. Thee porporations engaged in this industry, there are from one point of view not zeriously embarrassed. For they can look with a comfotable feeling at the large cash nurplus which they have been accumulating partly for the purpose of meeting emergencies of this kind. This surplus will provide them with the means for meeting current expenses although these will be greatly reduced by the laying oZ of the men employed in the mines.
